Understanding the Importance of Dividends

A dividend consists of a portion of profits paid by a corporation to its shareholders and they add value to owning certain stocks.

Over time, dividends — when reinvested — can make a big difference in the amount accumulated in mutual funds. Over the 20-year period ending December 31, 2012, reinvested dividends accounted for 41% of the total return of the stock market, as measured by the unmanaged Standard & Poor's 500 Index. During flat or declining markets, like that of 2008-2009, dividends can often account for the only positive return an investor receives.

Within a retirement plan, dividends are automatically used to purchase more shares. Outside of a retirement plan, you can take dividends in cash if you need income to help meet living expenses. You can also reinvest your dividends to buy more fund shares, which can greatly increase the value of your mutual fund holdings over time.

Another option is to automatically invest dividends from one fund to another. Maybe you fear the stock market might decline before the money is needed. One solution is to invest in a bond fund and cross-reinvest the dividends into the stock fund. That way, you gain access to the growth potential of the stock market while your principal remains invested in the bond fund, which is typically less volatile.
