

Romance Scams are Real

According to the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department, area residents have become victims of dating scams. In fact, the problem is so severe the U.S. State Department issues warnings to citizens about scammers bilking unsuspecting residents.

Generally, scams begin on dating websites or other social media. The perpetrators misrepresent themselves looking for sympathetic, compassionate individuals, male or female. Once a dialog starts, they quickly move to intimate matters with the goal of eventually requesting money. Reasons for the money range from health and family issues, or travel to visit or even get married. **The scammer's only goal is for you to send money.** Romance fraud indicators include:

- · You met a friend/flancé online.
- You've never met face to face.
- Your correspondent professed love quickly.
- Your friend/fiancé needs a loan from you.
- You are promised repayment from an upcoming inheritance.
- Grammar usage not reflective of online personality.

These scammers are very effective in deception. Many individuals refuse to believe they are victims. If you, or someone you know, suspect a fraud, contact local police for assistance.
