# WinCU Annual Meeting

Our 70th Annual Meeting was held on March 7th at the LaSure's Banquet Hall. Chairperson Tom Geske reported loans grew by \$5.2 million to \$128 million, and assets decreased slightly to \$148.4 million. Credit union membership is now over 8,500. Carrie Walter, Julie Grandt, and Patty Felker were acknowledged



for their years of dedication and service, as they retired earlier this year. Members elected incumbent board members Tom Geske and Valinda Applebee to a three-year volunteer term.

Our sponsorship helps cover important costs like uniforms, equipment, and umpire fees, ensuring that these programs can continue to offer valuable experiences for the kids involved.



### Stepping Up in Red



Throughout the month of April, the WinCU team donated money to wear the color red (in honor of the Salvation Army), jeans, and tennis shoes. Kurt Maehl, Neenah Branch Manager/Mortgage Lender, challenged staff by matching the funds. The money donated was designated for the Salvation Army of Oshkosh's laundry services and temporary housing. In 2022-23, the laundry fund helped 227

families (346 adults, 557 children). Of these 227 families, 65 were helped more than once, indicating a continued need for laundry assistance, whereas 162 families only needed assistance once. People miss out on work, and children don't go to school often because of laundry issues. In January 2024, \$225 was spent for 20 general households alone, and the funds are almost completely depleted. Temporary housing/emergency hotel vouchers provide women or families with children one or two nights while waiting for more permanent housing. The Salvation Army pays approximately \$70 a night. Due to a lack of donations and tight budgets, these programs were almost depleted of funds, and thanks to the efforts of the credit union employees, local families will continue to have clean clothes and a safe place to lay their heads at night.

### **Elder Abuse Awareness Month: Protecting Seniors from Exploitation**

Elder abuse, particularly in the form of financial exploitation, is a growing concern that poses a significant threat to the well-being of seniors. As the elderly population continues to increase, it is essential to raise awareness about the risks of financial abuse and empower seniors with the knowledge and resources to protect themselves from exploitation.

Financial abuse of elders can take various forms, including scams, fraud, theft, and coercion. Perpetrators often target vulnerable seniors, taking advantage of their trust, cognitive impairments, or social isolation. Common tactics used in financial exploitation include deceptive telemarketing schemes, lottery/sweepstakes scams, charity scams, tax/debt collection scams, identity theft, misuse of a senior's assets by caregivers or family members, and fraudulent investment schemes. Often, older adults are reluctant to report the exploitation due to shame, embarrassment, fear of retaliation, denial, self-blame, or lack of awareness. Recognizing the signs of financial abuse is crucial in combating this issue and protecting seniors from harm.

If you are an older adult or know someone at risk, help educate them about common financial scams, the importance of safeguarding personal information, and how to make informed financial decisions.

In most instances of suspected elder abuse, including financial exploitation, you can visit www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/asp/index or call the Elder Abuse Hotline at 833.586.0107. You can find information about reaching your local Adult Protective Services office at the Eldercare Locator at eldercare.acl.gov, a public service provided by the U.S. Administration for Community Living, or by calling 800.677.1116. If the older person is in danger or you believe a crime has been committed, call 911 for an immediate response from the police. For identity theft cases, contact local police and the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) at 877.438.4338 or identitytheft.gov. If the loss involves funds held in a financial institution, such as a bank or credit union, report the problem to the financial institution immediately. If the loss involves credit products, such as a credit card or loan, contact the creditor immediately.
